

# CITY OF WILLOW PARK

ORDINANCE NO. 478 -02

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AN ORDER FOR AND CALLING OF A MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MAY 4, 2002 FOR THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN MUNICIPAL OFFICERS FOR THE CITY OF WILLOW PARK; COUNCILMEMBER PLACE 3, PLACE 4, AND PLACE 5; DESIGNATING A POLLING PLACE WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL LIMITS; APPOINTING A PRESIDING ELECTION JUDGE AND ALTERNATE PRESIDING ELECTION JUDGE; ESTABLISHING OTHER PROCEDURES FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ELECTION; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Willow Park is a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, it is intent of the City of Willow Park to protect the health, safety and welfare and well being of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, the City Council consists of a Mayor and five councilmembers elected according to a place system for staggered two year terms of office; the terms of office for councilmember for Place 3, Place 4, Place 5 will expire in May 2002; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 1, *General Provisions*, Article 1.300 *Municipal Election* provides that "all elections pertaining to municipal affairs shall be governed by the election laws of the State of Texas." and,

WHEREAS, a general election for certain municipal officers of the City of Willow Park, Texas has been ordered for May 4, 2002 under the authority of law; and

WHEREAS, the election so ordered for the City of Willow Park was ordered more than 45 days before the election day pursuant to §3.005, TEX. ELECTION CODE; and,

WHEREAS, May 4, 2002 is the first Saturday in May, which is prescribed as a uniform election date under §41.001 TEX. ELECTION CODE; and

WHEREAS, the City Secretary is designated under §83.005 as the early voting clerk for elections ordered on behalf of a municipality; and

WHEREAS, §32.005 provides for the appointment of a presiding election judge and an alternate presiding judge for the single elections so designated and ordered; and

WHEREAS, the TEX. ELECTION CODE §87.001 provides for the appointment of the early voting ballot board and §87.002 for the composition of the board.

**NOW THEREFORE: BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLOW PARK, TEXAS:**

## SECTION 1. INCORPORATION

All of the above precatory statements are true and correct and incorporated herein for all purposes.

## SECTION 2. DATE OF ELECTION

It is hereby ordered that an election for municipal officers shall be held in and throughout the City of Willow Park, Texas on Saturday, May 4, 2002.

### SECTION 3. PURPOSE OF ELECTION

The purpose of the election is to provide for the general election of city officers, specifically councilmember Place No. 3, councilmember Place No. 4, councilmember Place No. 5, for a term of two years.

### SECTION 4. POLLING PLACE

The City of Willow Park polling place shall be: Willow Park City Hall, 101 Stagecoach Trail, Willow Park, Texas

In accordance with §41.031(A) TEX. ELECTION CODE, said polling place shall be open between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on the date of election.

### SECTION 5 ELECTION JUDGES

The following named persons, residing at the respective addresses, are hereby appointed to serve as presiding election judge and alternate presiding judge respectively:

Presiding Judge: Pat Reams

All election judges shall be qualified voters of the City. The City Secretary shall in accord with §32.009 of the TEX. ELECTION CODE deliver to the Presiding Election Judge and the Alternate Presiding Election Judge notice of their appointment not later than 20 days from the effective date of this ordinance

### SECTION 6. APPOINTMENT OF CLERKS

The Election Judge herein appointed shall appoint not more than three eligible persons as clerks to serve and assist in the conduct of election provided, however, that if the Election Judge named herein actually serves, the Alternate Election Judge shall serve as one of the clerks. All election clerks shall be qualified voters of the City.

### SECTION 7. COMPENSATION OF THE JUDGING CLERKS

The Election Judge, Alternate Election Judge and each Election Clerk shall be compensated at an hourly rate not to exceed \$6.00 per hour, which is an amount that exceeds the federal minimum hourly wage pursuant to §32.019(A) of the TEX. ELECTION CODE.

The Election Judge or Clerk who delivers the returns of the election, keys to the ballot boxes or other election equipment, and unused election supplies will also be paid the additional sum of \$25.00 for delivering such materials pursuant to §32.092 of the TEX. ELECTION CODE.

### SECTION 8. METHOD OF VOTING

The City Secretary is hereby authorized and instructed to provide and furnish all necessary election supplies to conduct the election.

### SECTION 9. GOVERNING LAW QUALIFIED VOTERS

The election shall be held in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Texas and the TEX. ELECTION CODE and all resident, qualified electors of the City shall be eligible to vote at the election.

### SECTION 10. PUBLICATION AND POSTING OF NOTICE

Notice of the City election shall be given by posting a Notice of Election at the City of Willow Park on the bulletin board or other location used for posting notices of the meetings of the City Council, not later than 21 days prior to the date of the election, and by publication of said notice at least once in the newspaper published in the City, or if none, in a newspaper of general circulation. The date of said publication to be not less than 10 days nor more than 30 days prior to the date set for the election. Upon publication of the election notice, the City Secretary shall secure a Publisher's Affidavit which complies with the requirements of the TEX. ELECTION CODE.

SECTION 11. EARLY VOTING

Early voting shall commence in the office of the City Secretary on April 17, 2002, and shall continue Monday through Friday from 8:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. on April 30, 2002.

SECTION 12. DELIVERY OF RETURNS

Immediately after closing the polling place on the date of the election, the election officers named in this Ordinance shall make four copies of the returns. The returns shall be delivered as follows: One copy shall be retained by the Election Judge; one copy shall be delivered to the Mayor of the City of Willow Park; one copy shall be delivered to the Voter Registrar; one copy shall be delivered to the City Secretary along with the ballot boxes and election supplies. All election records and supplies shall be preserved by the City Secretary in accord with the TEX. ELECTION CODE.

SECTION 13. CANVASSING RETURNS

The City Council, pursuant to §67.003, TEX. ELECTION CODE, shall convene no earlier than the third day nor later than the sixth day after the election to canvass the returns of the election.

SECTION 14. NECESSARY ACTIONS

The Mayor, City Council, City Secretary in consultation with the City Attorney are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions necessary to comply with the provisions with the TEX. ELECTION CODE in carrying out and conducting the election whether or not specifically authorized herein.
